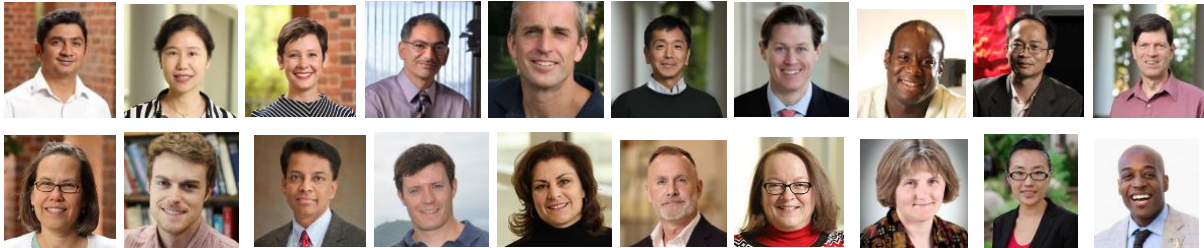

- Partnered with UVA's School of Commerce (#6 [Masters in Management](#)) to help increase MAE Master of Engineering enrollment by 420% in 3 years

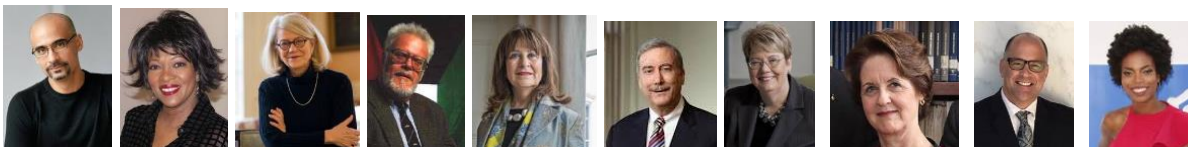

MAE Diversity, Outreach, Infrastructure and Finances

- Set up several new [Diversity, Inclusion and Excellence Task Forces](#) to revise faculty hiring, annual faculty reporting, student recruiting, and department culture

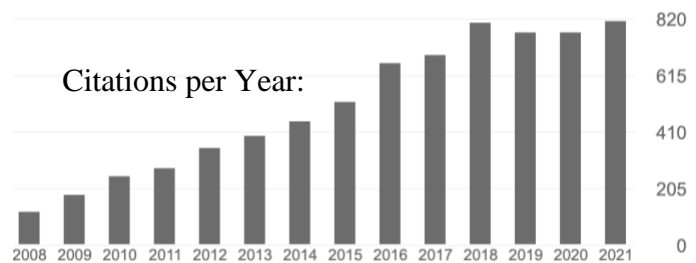
